#### **JUBILEE 2025**

Dear brothers and sisters: In our continuing catechesis on this Holy Year's theme of "Jesus Christ our Hope", we now reflect on the humility of the Son of God, who chose to enter our human history not with resounding proclama-

tions but in poverty and simplicity. Born in Bethlehem, a town whose name means "House of Bread", Jesus — the Bread come down from heaven to satisfy the hunger of the world — is laid in a manger because there is no room for him in the inn.

The place to go to meet the Messiah is a manger. In fact, it happens that, after so much waiting, "there is no room for the Savior of the world, for Him in whose sight all things were created" (Benedict XVI, The Childhood of Jesus, 2012, 80). The shepherds thus learn that in a very humble place, reserved for animals, the long-awaited Messiah is born and is born for them, to be their Savior, their Shepherd. News that opens their hearts to wonder, praise and joyful announcement. «Unlike so many people intent on doing a thousand other things, shepherds become the first witnesses of the essential, that is, of the salvation that is given. It is the humblest and poorest who know how to welcome the event of the Incarnation" (Apostolic Letter Admirabile signum, 5).

Brothers and sisters, let us also ask for the grace to be, like the shepherds, capable of amazement and praise before God, and capable of safeguarding what He has entrusted to us: the talents, the charisms, our vocation and the people He places alongside us. We ask the Lord to be able to see in weakness the extraordinary strength of the Child God, who comes to renew the world and transform our lives with his hope-filled plan for all humanity.
